Treasurer's Report



Welcome to all our members and thank you for your continued support of the club.

The Audit and Financial reports have been finalised by the auditor and accountant, and we can report this year we had a turnover of \$592,845.96 an increase on the 2020 FY of approximately \$90,868.02.

The most significant factors that have lead to an increase in our overall turnover is: We were awarded Grant monies of \$65,000 from the Community Building partnerships fund which will be invested to develop the new BBQ shelter and storage facilities to be finished in 2022.

We were also awarded the Greater Cities Sport Infrastructure Grant of \$400,000 that will allow a number of upgrades to Jellicoe park, this is an agreement between PBFC, Bayside Council and Office of Sport, that we applied for in 2020 and are working on providing the following:

- Lighting upgrade to install a new centre pole, changeover to all new LED lighting which will increase our overall LUX levels, provide better lighting distribution and reduction in glare, allowing for the playing of night matches.
- A portion of this will also be allocate to the BBQ shelter and storage
- Solar panels and water tank
- Safety fencing to the northern area
- Increase in trees

Our largest income stream continues to be registrations, however these were down 15% mainly due to Covid 19 and we have experienced a reduction in sponsorships of \$37,000 (34% reduction), mainly due to our business partners who have also struggled with Covid 19 restrictions.

We would like to acknowledge the continuing support of our Major sponsors in NG Farah and the Newmarket hotel, also the Budget petrol Group, Maroubra Building supplies and all our smaller team sponsors.

The audited figures show an overall profit of \$224,782.55, however with adjustment of \$120K and \$65K of Grant funding monies this will reduces to around \$40,000.

Our total closing bank balances are \$367,809.94.

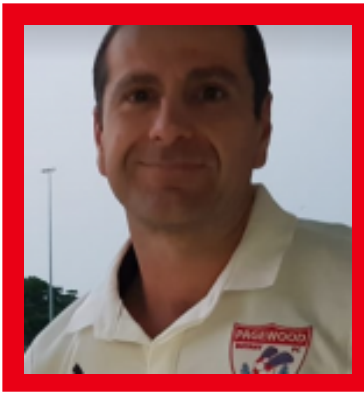
